Our humble beginnings that started out in community library meeting rooms, as a way to help veterans understand, submit, and receive the benefits they were entitled, has now become a life-changing reality for over 800 veterans, their families and our homeless community. For those of you who are reading this report, from the time it was published, it has been an incredible year of resilience, self-reflection, steadfastness, and hope. Our theme, "Where Home and Hope Begin Again" has been born out of desire and concern to keep fighting for unhoused veterans and our uhoused community.

The respect we have for our devoted volunteers, faithful supporters, reliable individual and corporate donors has grown exponentially. The steadfast support for our unhoused veterans, their children, and their care, especially during a national and global pandemic, received our utmost gratitude.

Your support is a big reason for our continued success. Without you, the future of Genesis would look very different now. For the last two years we have been structuring the organization's personnel, embracing technology, engaging in grant opportunities, and seeking appropriate housing and employment for our unhoused veterans, their children, and our unhoused community.

Just a small recap: Established 501c(3) in April 12, 2012; Received Donated Blighted Property (abandoned 13 years) in October, 2016; Commenced Renovating Property in December 2016; Hosted our 1st Annual Toy Drive for Veterans and Their Children in 2016; Grand Opening in May 24, 2022 - Making History by Creating the First Transitional Housing Facility in the State of Georgia to House our Unhoused Female Veterans; Established the Genesis Joy House Resource Center (for our entire community) in 2023.

Our ability to grow, think, respond, adapt, and overcome, during Genesis' most critical times has allowed us to continue our monumental cause to eradicate homelessness among our veterans, their children, and our unhoused community - helping to move them towards self-sufficiency and independence.

Genesis has the leadership team, the foundational support, the foresight, and the humble instinct to remain a viable nonprofit that advocates for veterans. Your continued support has allowed us to remain a solvent, relevant, and proactive community asset.





What We Do

Case Management – Our case managers assist veterans in understanding the right resources to help them in determining benefits and services they have earned.

Benefits Counseling Service - Our benefits counseling services ensure that veterans and their families take full advantage of all earned benefits available.

Employment Resources and Services - Our Resource Center, through community partnerships, provide a range of employment services and offers one on one assistance with job applications, resume preparation, job coaching, and pathways to overcome employment barriers.

Professional Licensed Counseling Services - Our counseling services refers to therapy and professional licensed counseling services provided to address mental health and chemical dependency needs of veterans. Offsite and virtual licensed staff provide clinical services including needs assessment.

Housing and Emergency Service - Our Resource Center provide housing services including emergency shelter through transitional, supportive, and independent living housing options.
